# **Dispute Resolution**

### **PLAYERS**:

When addressing player concerns or behavioural issues, it is essential to follow a structured and professional approach to ensure the matter is handled effectively, respectfully, and in the best interest of both the player and the team. The following steps outline the process for resolving such issues:

### **Step 1: Address the Player Directly**

- Action: Speak to the player in a timely manner, away from the playing group, in a calm and controlled environment.
- Purpose: This ensures the conversation is private, respectful, and constructive. It allows you to address the issue without escalating the situation or causing undue embarrassment in front of teammates.
- Outcome: Aim to resolve the issue directly with the player, providing clear and actionable feedback, while maintaining a positive and supportive approach.

### Step 2: Escalate to Your Netball Coordinator

If the issue persists or cannot be resolved directly with the player:

- Action: Contact your relevant Netball Coordinator (Shez for Juniors, Gem for Seniors).
- Purpose: The Netball Coordinator will provide guidance and support in addressing the issue further. They may also speak with the player or provide advice on next steps.
- Outcome: The goal is to resolve the concern at this stage through collaboration between the coach and the Netball Coordinator.

### **Step 3: Involve the Executive Committee**

If the issue remains unresolved after speaking with the Netball Coordinator:

 Action: You may escalate the matter to the Executive Committee for further assistance.

- Purpose: The Executive Committee will review the situation, consider all perspectives, and determine the appropriate course of action. This may involve a more formal meeting or a mediation process.
- Outcome: The Executive Committee will ensure that the issue is addressed fairly and that the resolution aligns with the club's values and policies.

# **Dispute Resolution**

### Parents:

At KBFNC, we value open communication between parents, players, and the club. Should any issues or concerns arise regarding a player's experience or behaviour, we encourage parents to follow this structured process to ensure a fair, respectful, and efficient resolution.

# Step 1: Address the Concern with the Coach Directly

- Action: If you have a concern about your child's behaviour, performance, or any other issue, the first step is to speak directly with the team coach. This conversation should take place at an appropriate time and in a calm, private setting away from the playing group to avoid unnecessary distractions or embarrassment.
- Purpose: Addressing the concern with the coach allows for an open, respectful dialogue where both sides can discuss the issue and work together toward a solution.
- Outcome: The coach will listen to your concern, assess the situation, and take steps to resolve it, keeping your child's wellbeing and development in mind as well as what is best for the team and the club.

### **Step 2: Escalate to the Netball Coordinator**

If you are unable to resolve the issue with the coach or feel that the matter requires further attention:

- Action: Contact the relevant Netball Coordinator (Shez for Juniors, Gem for Seniors) to escalate the concern.
- Purpose: The Netball Coordinator will help mediate the issue, gather information, and work with you and the coach to find a fair resolution. They can also offer guidance on how best to approach the situation.
- Outcome: Ideally, the issue will be resolved at this stage, with the Netball Coordinator facilitating communication and supporting both the player and the coach in reaching a resolution.

### **Step 3: Involve the Executive Committee**

If the issue remains unresolved after working with the Netball Coordinator:

- Action: You may escalate the concern to the Executive Committee for further assistance.
- Purpose: The Executive Committee will review the situation in a formal manner, considering all perspectives and relevant details. A committee member will engage in a discussion with you to determine an appropriate course of action.
- Outcome: The Executive Committee will make a decision in line with the club's policies and values, ensuring a fair and impartial resolution to the concern.

# KBFNC ENDORSES NETBALL VICTORIA'S CODES OF BEHAVIOUR

### PLAYER CODE OF CONDUCT

In addition to Netball Victoria's General Code of Conduct, as a player in any activity held by or under the

auspices of Netball Victoria, Region, an Affiliated Association/League or Club you must meet the

following requirements in regard to your conduct during any such activity or event.

- 1. Fully comply with the Child Safety in Netball Code of Conduct.
- 2. Participate because you enjoy it, not just to please parents and coaches.
- 3. Play by the rules.
- 4. Know the rules.
- 5. Participate fairly and safely.
- 6. Abide by decisions, without argument or bad temper.
- 7. Captains have the right to approach an umpire during an interval or after the game for

clarification of any rule.

- 8. Approach the umpire in a courteous and polite way.
- 9. Cooperate with your coach, and other players, deliberately fouling or provoking an

opponent and throwing / damaging equipment is not acceptable or permitted.

- 10. Cooperate with your coach, and other players.
- 11. Treat all players as you would like to be treated.

- 12. Ensure that at all times your behaviour is fair.
- 13. Be a patient and enthusiastic, supporter of fellow players.
- 14. Applaud all good play, by your own team and opponents.
- 15. Be a responsible team member.
- 16. Always be on time.
- 17. Encourage and assist all players.
- 18. Attend all training sessions.
- 19. Be a positive role model
- 20. Ensure you always bring the appropriate uniform and equipment to training and/or

games.

- 21. Respect and acknowledge the contribution of those who create the opportunity for you to play (volunteers, scorers, coaches, timekeepers, administrators and umpires).
- 22. Not make or post inappropriate, offensive or discriminatory comments in public, including social media about players, clubs, umpires or officials.
- 23. Not take part in any form of bullying or discrimination regardless of gender, ability, sexual orientation, cultural background or religion.

### **GUARDIAN CODE OF CONDUCT**

In addition to Netball Victoria's General Code of Conduct, as a parent/guardian in any activity held by

or under the auspices of Netball Victoria, Region, an Affiliated Association/League or Club you must

meet the following requirements in regard to your conduct during any such activity or event.

- 1. Fully comply with the Child Safety in Netball Code of Conduct.
- 2. If your child is interested, encourage them to participate in the appropriate netball

activity. However, if your child is not willing to participate, do not force him or her.

# Remember, children are involved in organised activity for their enjoyment, not yours.

3. Focus upon your child's effort and performance rather than the overall outcome of the

event. This assists your child in setting realistic goals related to his/her ability by

reducing the emphasis on winning.

4. Teach your child that an honest effort is as important as victory, so that the result of

each game is accepted without undue disappointment.

- 5. Encourage your child to always play according to the rules.
- 6. Never ridicule or yell at a child for making a mistake or losing a game.

- 7. Remember that children learn best from example. Applaud good play by all players.
- 8. If you disagree with an umpire or coach raise the issue through the appropriate

channels rather than question their judgement and honesty in public.

- 9. Not engage in physical and/or verbal intimidation, abuse or conduct toward any player, official, umpire or supporter.
- 10. Recognise and respect the value and importance of volunteer administrators, coaches,

and umpires. They give up their time and resources to provide recreational activities

for players and deserve your support.

- 11. Be a model of good sports behaviour for children to copy.
- 12. Be courteous in communication with administrators, coaches, players and umpires.

Teach children to do likewise.

- 13. Support the use of age appropriate development activities and modified rules.
- 14. Do not publicly criticise Umpires and instead raise personal concerns with club officials in private
- 15. Not take part in any form of bullying including via the use of social media.

### Non- compliance:

Parents or others found to have behaved inappropriately, and who are associate members or have agreed to abide by our clubs code of conduct, may face disciplinary actions as outlined in our Member Protection Policy



Our Club is a Fair Play Club. We expect the following standards of behaviour from every person involved in our club – player, member, administrator, official, or spectator:

## Integrity

- Be honest, fair, reliable and transparent.
- Avoid conflicts of interest.
- · Strive to earn and maintain community trust.
- Don't engage in, or advocate possession or use of banned performance enhancing or illicit drugs.
- Don't participate in, or encourage match-fixing, illegal sports betting or other corruption.

### Respect

- Treat everyone in a considerate, objective and courteous manner.
- Refrain from any form of discrimination, harassment, bullying, abuse, intimidation, victimisation or vilification of others.
- Recognise and value the contribution of all.

# Responsibility

- Accept the consequences of your actions.
- Be a positive role model.
- Comply with child safe standards.
- Understand the consequences of breaching the Code. Report and deal with breaches.

### **Fairness**

- Play by the rules and spirit of the game.
- Be informed, consistent, impartial, just and reasonable.
- Be a 'good sport'.
- Provide a 'fair go' to people of all abilities.

## Safety

- Provide a safe, welcoming and inclusive environment.
- Ensure equipment, facilities and programs meet standards.
- Support injury management, return to play and child safe standards policies.
- Show concern and caution for others. Immediately report any issues.
